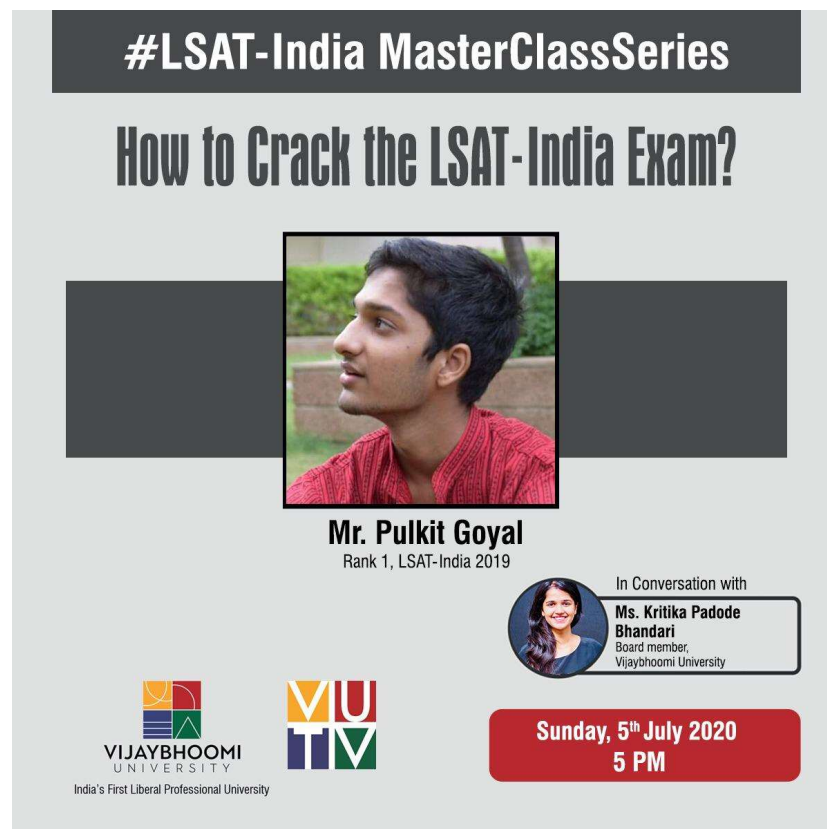

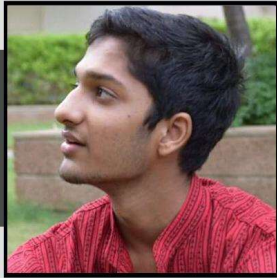

Learnings

- The number of questions is not fixed it may vary from 25-29 questions in each section with 35 minutes to solve questions in a section.
 - LSAT has no negative marking
 - Total time duration of the exam is 3 hours.
 - Reading is a big component of the LSAT especially reading comprehension.
 - A good trick to increase your reading speed is to focus on your peripheral vision.
 - The passage might be form of philosophical, scientific journal paper, discovery of fossils, literary critics etc,
 - In the analytical reasoning section practice plenary questions to score higher marks in the section.
 - Logical reasoning contains the following topics that are tested:
 - Strengthening weakening of arguments
 - Identification of flaws in the argument
 - Identifying the inference
 - Practice multiple LSAT India and LSAT USA sample papers to expose yourself to more questions. GMAT preparation books are a great source for Critical Reasoning questions.
 - Focus on quality of preparation rather than quantity
