Takeaway **Learnings**

- The gender equality figurine by metropolitan educational institutions is baseless without rural school data.
- To educate is to draw potential from a child; expectations from socially construct biases on both ends of the learning process suffocates education.
- Ends of the spectrum feel the differences in gender biases. Children absorb roles that play in a social setting and develop on that path.
- Interventions at the school level through unisex uniforms, equal play, sensitization workshops, and orienting teachers that establish two-way communication between the proponents of an institution alleviate gender stresses.
- Talking, understanding, and solution-giving practices at homes and schools ensure the child that the world is a safe place to share problems and reach out for help.
- The grasp has not spared nursery kids as well. With social media, life is often lived and ended on screens. As adults, spending time with your children, irrespective of settings is a priority.
- Thinking on the 5Ws and 1H of responding gauges the child's reaction to the remark. If the child is offended, communication cuts down until disaster happens.
- A teacher plays more than the role of an educator and knows their children inside out.
- Adopting the Know Your Child (KYC) leads to a consistent, intentional, and respectful relationship with your child that sows the right seeds for a confident adult.
