VUSAT (Vijaybhoomi Scholastic Aptitude Test), a national level admission test, is conducted by the University for admission in undergraduate and post-graduate programmes. The admission test is conducted in “online” mode. The VUSAT test has been developed in collaboration with Mercer Mettle. Candidates seeking admission to VU will be evaluated on the basis of entrance examination (EE) score (30% weightage). 2. Personal Interview (PI) score (70% weightage), and recommendation of the panel called as Admission Selection Process (ASP) including academic record. 3. Then, the results are communicated by email and through Admission counsellors about the selection, then the offer letters are issued through a system and then students if interested to join are guided further for payment of fees, joining dates and other processes to report at the campus.
